## Cement donation for Church Construction

In March 2025, the Akwaka Foundation supported the construction of the Kugri Assemblies of God Church in the Upper East Region by an initial funding of 50 bags of cement, amounting to ₵6,250. We are also grateful to Prophet Samuel Frimpong who also provided funding to begin the purchase of the iron rods .

The church expressed deep gratitude, sharing photos and videos of their joy as they move closer to leaving their classroom worship space for a permanent building.
